SUBJECT: Evaluation of Airborne ISR Allocation Process Supporting Counterterrorism
Operations in Afghanistan (Project No. D2016-DISPA2-0195.000)

We plan to begin the subject Evaluation in early August 2016. Our objective is to determine whether US Forces-Afghanistan's (USFOR-A) airborne Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance (ISR) allocation process effectively supports US counterterrorism (CT) operations. We will consider suggestions from management on additional or revised objectives.

We will perform the evaluation at selected subordinate components of USCENTCOM, USSOCOM, and the Joint Staff. We may identify additional locations during the evaluation.
