Former Defense Civilian Management Service Employee Sentenced On Possession of Child Pornography Charges

The Office of the Inspector General (OIG) of the Department of Defense (DoD) announced today that on October 20, 2005, Jose Medina, a former network security manager for the Defense Civilian Personnel Management Service (DCPMS), Information Systems Division, Arlington, VA, was sentenced by U.S. District Court Judge William Quarles, District of Maryland, to twelve months, one day incarceration, followed by three years supervised release. On November 8, 2004, Medina pled guilty to a one count Indictment charging him with violating 18 U.S.C. § 2252(a)(4)(B), possession of child pornography.

An investigation determined that Medina utilized his DoD office laptop computer to view and store child pornography. He left his position with the DCPMS on August 27, 2004.

The investigation was conducted by the Defense Criminal Investigative Service (the criminal investigative arm of the OIG DoD) and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The prosecution was handled by Assistant United States Attorney Bonnie Greenberg, U.S. Attorney's Office, District of Maryland.
