This course, offered on-line through the Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School Distributed Learning at <https://jagu.army.mil>, is being made available in the National Capital Region through a partnership between the Deputy Inspector General for Auditing, DoD Office of Inspector General, and the Chair of the Fiscal Law Department at the Judge Advocate General's Legal Center and School. The same professors who teach the Distributed Learning Comptroller Accreditation Course offered through JAGU will present it at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, in June 2015. The following is an overview of what to expect from this 3½-day offering:

- Meets the mandatory training requirements for the Army's Comptroller Accreditation Program for CP11 and FA45 personnel;
- Explains the statutory, regulatory, and policy authorities governing the commitment, obligation, and expenditure of appropriated funds;
- Provides an overview of fiscal law, including Purpose, Time, and the Antideficiency Act, as well as fiscal issues facing DoD; and
- Covers continuing resolutions, construction funding, interagency acquisitions, the Judgment Fund, and accountable officer liability.

Audience: Comptrollers, finance and accounting officers, contracting officers, program managers, auditors, budget analysts, attorneys, and others with oversight responsibilities for DoD funds at all levels of the Federal Government

- Where:** Defense Acquisition University, Scott Hall, Howell Auditorium, 9820 Belvoir Road, Building 226, Fort Belvoir, VA 22060
- Registration:** Participants must register in the Army Training Requirements and Resource System (ATRRS) through their respective agency's quota ATRRS manager.
- Cost:** There is no cost for the course, although participants are solely responsible for any ancillary expenses associated with their attendance.
- Materials:** The text for the course is the 2015 Fiscal Law Deskbook. Participants must download a copy and bring it with them to the course.
- The 2015 Fiscal Law Deskbook, and other course-related information, is available for download from the DoD OIG's Internet home page, <http://www.dodig.mil>. Once at the site, click on the Comptroller Accreditation and Fiscal Law course link under the "What's New" heading. This will take you to a page where the course flyer, registration spreadsheet, and the course text, the 2015 Fiscal Law Deskbook, can be downloaded.
- Credit:** This course meets mandatory training requirements for the Comptroller Accreditation Program for CP11 and FA45 personnel.
- Participants will receive 23.5 hours of Continuing Professional Education credits toward their 24- and 80-hour requirement established by Government Auditing Standards. Continuing Legal Education credit (CLEs) has historically been granted for the course; participants requesting CLE must apply individually through their state bar.
- To receive credit for successfully completing this course, participants are required to ***attend all sessions each day and must sign in twice daily to verify their attendance.***
- Dress Policy:** Attire for civilian personnel is business casual. Army personnel may wear their Army Combat Uniform (ACU). Attendees from sister services may wear comparable service uniforms.
