1. "_____ for Women" was one of the most popular and recognizable slogans used by members of the woman's suffrage movement.
2. The "Declaration of _____" was written in 1848 and read at the first women's rights convention. It asserted the equality of all men and women and argued that women were oppressed by the government and patriarchal society including the right to vote, representation in government, property rights in marriage, inequality in divorce law, education and employment. Sixty-eight women and 32 men, including abolitionist Frederick Douglass, signed it.
3. The year 2020 marks the _____ Anniversary of the 19th Amendment.
4. The National Archives celebrates the centennial of the 19th Amendment's ratification with its newest exhibit, _____ Hers: American Women and the Vote. The exhibit is free and open to the public in the Lawrence F. O'Brien Gallery at the National Archives Museum; however, with the current COVID-19 concerns, the exhibit is closed to the public until further notice.
5. The fourth annual _____ March on Washington took place on January 18, 2020.
6. The women in the suffrage movement, and the men, took Susan B. Anthony's phrase "_____ is impossible" and made it their motto.
